DUTIES OF THE POSITION

Student will do basic social sciences research tasks such as literature reviews, data coding and analysis, data entry, conduct and transcribe interviews, develop survey questions, archival research, and field observations. Other tasks depend upon the specific project. Student will be expected to meet regularly with their faculty mentor and other team members.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

The ability to learn and perform assigned work; work cooperatively with faculty, staff, and other students; and accept responsibility. Completion of specific coursework may be required in order to teach, grade, complete research, or tutor for a course. Admission or registration as a University student. Note: Exceptions to the minimum eligibility qualifications may be granted at the sole discretion of the University.

HIRING CRITERIA

Completed at least one year of college coursework with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Prior research experience or skills are not required.

Instructional Student Assistants, who must be currently enrolled University students, perform tutoring, grading, or teaching-related duties under the supervision of faculty or professional staff.
