DUTIES OF THE POSITION

This student will work with the graduate outreach coordinator, SSU faculty and staff, and other students to interact with the local and wider community and let them know about our educational and research activities. This may involve producing displays for educational purposes and will involve discussing outreach displays with community members. Student will prepare posts to social media platforms that are used by students, parents, alumni, potential donors, and community members. Student will also work with staff of the Center for Environmental Inquiry to support events and collaborative outreach projects. Support will be provided by an Instructionally Related Activities award to support student activities.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

The ability to learn and perform assigned work; work cooperatively with faculty, staff, and other student; and accept responsibility. Completion of specific coursework may be required in order to teach, grade or tutor a course. Admission or registration as a University student. Note: Exceptions to the minimum eligibility qualifications may be granted at the sole discretion of the University.
