DUTIES OF THE POSITION

The incumbent will develop educational XR content for faculty using Unreal Engine. The requirements of this position include: Meeting with faculty clients to understand the game design and engineering requirements, working on a team to accomplish design goals, work with faculty in setting up the application in the VITaL Lab within the Makerspace, and assist faculty in using XR software. Must be a self starter, good communicator, and must work well on a team. Minimum requirements would be a computer science background with Junior standing. Must be familiar with Unreal Engine.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

The ability to learn and perform assigned work; work cooperatively with faculty, staff, and other students; and accept responsibility. Completion of specific coursework may be required in order to teach, grade, complete research, or tutor for a course. Admission or registration as a University student. Note: Exceptions to the minimum eligibility qualifications may be granted at the sole discretion of the University.

HIRING CRITERIA

Minimum requirements would be a computer science background with Junior standing. Must be familiar with Unreal Engine.
