DUTIES OF THE POSITION

As a Genentech Fellow, you can expect the following;

- Regular check-ins with your Principal Investigator (Faculty Member)
- Bi-weekly check-ins with the other Genentech Fellows.
- Submitting and presenting a final project (research poster).
- Fellows will work 25 hours per week for 10 weeks at \$20.00/hour

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

The ability to learn and perform assigned work; work cooperatively with faculty, staff, and other students; and accept responsibility. Completion of specific coursework may be required in order to teach, grade, complete research, or tutor for a course. Admission or registration as a University student. Note: Exceptions to the minimum eligibility qualifications may be granted at the sole discretion of the University.

HIRING CRITERIA

This program is intended for current undergraduate MESA Members. Students must work with Sonoma State Faculty when conducting their research.

- Submit a Letter of Support on the student's behalf that includes

- Confirmation that the Student and the P.I. have discussed the proposed project.
- Confirmation that the P.I. has or can acquire the facilities and materials necessary for the proposed project.

- The classification, Instructional Student Assistant, is one of three classifications in a collective bargaining unit, Unit 11.
